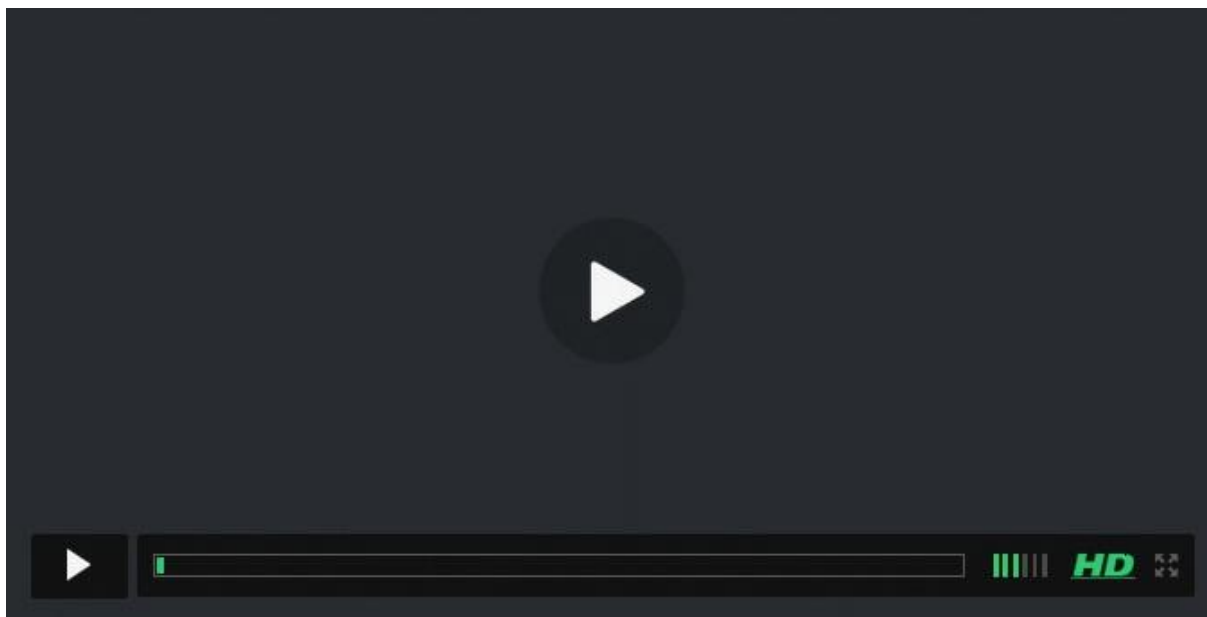


# !HERE'S\* WAY TO WATCH Dublin vs Derry LIVE STREAMS GAA Football ON TV CHANNEL

Dublin vs Derry team news as Kieran McGeeney makes two changes for round three clash. The Orchard County are already through to the last eight of the Championship, but they look set to field a strong team against the Tribesmen

Dublin manager Kieran McGeeney has stuck to his guns and named a strong team for Saturday evening's Group Four showdown with Derry in Kingspan Breffni.

The defending champions are the only team already guaranteed of their place in the quarter-finals as group winners with two wins from two outings.

McGeeney's side withstood a late rally to beat Derry at the Box-It Athletic Grounds in round one before claiming a five-point win over Dublin in Croke Park last time out.

In the aftermath of that game, the Dublin boss insisted he wouldn't field a 'B' team against Derry, saying: "You can't, because you'll go soft."

Dublin might wish to take the opportunity to try and land a knockout blow on one of their main rivals for the Sam Maguire in a tie which is a repeat of last summer's All-Ireland SFC final.

Derry need to beat the side that got the better of them in last summer's All-Ireland SFC final if they are to make sure of their passage into the quarter-finals of the championship.

Last year's finalists collide in a round three encounter that could spell the end of the road for one of the favourites to lift the Sam Maguire this year.

Not Dublin, who are already through to the last eight after beating Derry and Dublin in the group phase - those victories make the Orchard men the first side to progress after two games.

Kieran McGeeney has still named a strong line-up despite having the opportunity to rest key players, so perhaps the plan is to go full throttle in an attempt to knock out one of Dublin's main rivals for the crown.

If Derry lose, they will have to hope that Dublin can do them a favour against Derry but the margin of defeats will also play a part in the overall outcome of the group.

Only a victory will guarantee Pádraic Joyce's side a place in the knock-out stages and that knowledge may be enough to spur the Tribesmen to victory.
